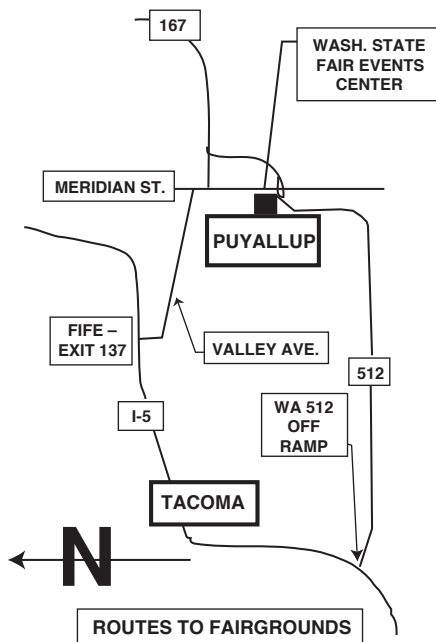

### DIRECTIONS TO THE WASHINGTON STATE FAIR EVENTS CENTER



**FROM OLYMPIA AND THE SOUTH:** Take I-5 North to Hwy. 512, Exit 127. Follow Hwy. 512 east for 10 miles to the Meridian St., S. Exit. Turn left under the freeway. Fairgrounds are on the left.

**FROM SEATTLE AND THE NORTH:** Take I-5 South to the Puyallup Exit #142B in Federal Way. As exiting, stay in the left lane. Turn right at the traffic light at the end of the exit ramp, then turn left at the first traffic light onto Hwy. 161. Travel approximately eight miles into the Puyallup Valley (Hwy. 161 becomes Meridian St. in Puyallup). Continue south through town. The Fairgrounds will be on your right at 9th Ave. S.W.

**FROM BELLEVUE AND EASTSIDE:** Take I-90 to I-405 South. Take Exit 2 to Hwy. 167 toward Kent/Auburn. Travel South on Hwy. 167 for approximately 20.2 miles to Hwy. 161 South/Hwy. 512 W. Travel 2.3 miles to the second exit, Meridian St. S. At the light at the end of the exit turn right. Fairgrounds are on the left.

### FROM SEATAC AIRPORT:

**Option 1:** Depart airport, taking exit to I-5 and I-405. Follow signs to I-405 Northbound toward Renton and Bellevue. Take Exit 2, Hwy. 167 South toward Kent/Auburn. Travel south on Hwy. 167 for 20.2 miles to 161 South/512 West. Follow Hwy. 512 West to Puyallup and Olympia, traveling 2.3 miles. Take the second exit, Meridian Street South. Turn right at the light at the end of the exit. The fairgrounds are on the left, on the corner of Ninth and Meridian (Cattin's Restaurant is on the corner).  
**Option 2:** Take I-5 south to the Puyallup Exit #142B in Federal Way. As exiting, stay in the left lane. Turn right at the traffic light at the end of the exit ramp, then turn left at the first traffic light onto Hwy 161. Travel approximately eight miles into Puyallup Valley. (Hwy. 161 becomes Meridian Street in Puyallup). Continue south through town. The Fairgrounds are on the corner of Meridian and 9th Ave. S.W. (Cattins Restaurant is on the corner)

## ATTENTION – SHOW GROUND RULES

- **Gray water cannot be dumped or dripped on the ground. The appropriate sewer hookup or dump station should be used for depositing all gray (and black) water. Security will enforce the “no dumping” rule. There is a \$500.00 fine for all/any infractions of this policy.**
  - An EMT will be on Show Grounds Each Day
  - THE GROUNDS WILL BE AVAILABLE FOR SET-UP OF GROOMING EQUIPMENT FROM 11:00AM until 7:00 PM on Friday, July 6.
  - **CONTROL OF THE GROOMING AND CRATING AREAS WILL BE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE GROUNDS CHAIRMAN.** No roping off or saving of grooming areas. Show Committee reserves the right to rearrange crates etc., in the non-reserved grooming area in order to make more room. Grooming equipment left in day grooming area after Best in Show will be confiscated.
  - Grooming and Crating area aisles must remain open at all times.
  - No Grooming or exercise pens, Cocker pens, Toy pens or canopies are allowed in the Show Buildings. Crates are only allowed in the show building during showing of your breed and must be removed immediately after. Violators will be fined \$25.00 per occurrence.
  - Grounds will be open at 6:00AM Sat. through Mon., and close two (2) hours after Best in Show each day. All buildings must be vacated two hours after Best in Show on Monday. Reserved Overnight Parking available until 10:00AM on Tuesday.
  - There will be no parking on the Fairgrounds. Violators will be towed at the owners' risk and expense.
  - **Loss or Damage** - The Show Committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of any accident or misfortune, to either dogs or exhibitors participating in these Shows. The welfare of an Exhibitor's child is assumed to be the responsibility of the Exhibitor/Parent. It is distinctly understood that exhibitors will exercise control and restraint over their children on the day of the shows **OR THE EXHIBITOR/PARENT WILL BE ASKED TO LEAVE THE SHOW PREMISES.**
  - The only fresh water available on the grounds will be in the restrooms. Exhibitors are responsible for the water required for the safety and comfort of their dogs. No bathing of dogs on the show grounds.
  - Exhibitors and Handlers will be held responsible for clean conditions in and around their grooming area, parking area and hotel room.
  - Exhibitors will be responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. X-pens will be provided outside. Exhibitors and handlers must pick up fecal matter deposited by their dogs on the grounds, streets, sidewalks and parking lots.
  - **Speed limit within the Fairgrounds is 5MPH.** Anyone exceeding this speed limit will be subject to an Event Show Hearing, and/or escorted off the grounds immediately.
  - **If it is necessary to rescue a dog from a parked vehicle on the show grounds or in the parking areas, the club will not be responsible or liable for any damage to the vehicle involved.** Animals left in vehicles will be monitored by County Control Officers and Club Members. If animals are in distress due to heat or any other circumstances, the vehicle will be forcibly entered, the animal recovered and the owner cited.
  - **ALL ELECTRICAL DEVICES WHICH CREATE MULTIPLE OUTLETS MUST BE UL APPROVED AND INCORPORATE A SEPARATE CIRCUIT BREAKER WITHIN THE DEVICE.** All electrical cords on floor must be taped.
  - No Smoking will be allowed or tolerated in any building on the Show Site. Offenders of the rule shall be subject to a fine not to exceed \$50.00, and in the event of continued abuse, shall be asked to leave the show premises.
  - **TROPHIES** – Trophies and prizes will be awarded in the judging rings to the person exhibiting the dog, who will be considered to be the owner or agent of the owner. All claims for trophies and other prizes must be made in the judging ring before the completion of the judging of the breed, and the Show Chairmen advised at once in the event of any discrepancy. No Award will be mailed. The Clubs reserve the right to substitute a prize of equal or greater value.
- THESE RULES WILL BE ENFORCED BY THE SHOW COMMITTEE. FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THESE RULES WILL RESULT IN CHARGES BEING BROUGHT BEFORE THE SHOW COMMITTEE.**

## COMBINED OBEDIENCE TRIAL & RALLY TRIAL – SATURDAY, JULY 7, 2018

### BASENJIS AND RHODESIAN RIDGEBACKS ONLY

All Obedience & Rally classes Will Be Held Indoors. With the approval of the American Kennel Club, Obedience and Rally Trial classes for Basenjis and Rhodesian Ridgebacks will be consolidated to provide maximum efficiency in scheduling and judging. The Judging Program will include a complete list of breeds to be judged, and the order in which they will be judged. All Specialties that are offering Combined Obedience Classes will be judged together. Each dog will be judged and individual scores recorded in the respective breed's judge's book. For the group exercises in Obedience, all breeds will be judged in one group. If there are more dogs competing than can be spaced four (4) feet per dog on one side of a ring, some must be judged in another group. The judge will divide the class into equal sections and the group exercise will be judged after each section. Following completion of group exercises, the judge will complete the judge's books for all dogs entered in each Obedience class in the respective breed's judge's book. Ribbons and awards will then be awarded by breed. Qualifying points in Obedience are based on the number of dogs in each breed only. All Specialties that are offering Combined Rally Classes will be judged together. Each dog will be judged and individual scores recorded in the respective breed's judge's book. The judge will complete the judge's books for all dogs entered in each Rally class in the respective breed's judge's book. Ribbons and awards will then be awarded by breed.

### TRANSFER OF ENTRIES

*NOTE: TRANSFER OF ENTRIES AND REQUESTS FOR REFUNDS FOR PUBLISHED JUDGE CHANGES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED IN THE OFFICE AFTER 5:00PM ON WEDNESDAY, JULY 11, 2018. AFTER THIS TIME, YOU MUST CONTACT THE SUPERINTENDENT ON SITE.*

**OBEDIENCE OR RALLY:** A transfer (i.e., from an obedience class to an obedience class; or a rally class to a rally class) may be requested if, according to the owner's records the handler and dog are eligible provided the club offers transfers. Transfers from an "A" to "B" class at the same level are allowed provided the host club allows transfers. The request for a transfer must be in writing and presented to the superintendent or trial secretary at least 30 minutes prior to the start of each trial. Clubs may choose to accept transfers prior to the day of the trial and this should be clearly stated in the premium list. Transfers may be approved provided the class and judge are available, and the class has not reached its limit.

### OBEDIENCE AND RALLY EXHIBITORS, PLEASE NOTE

In an effort to accommodate more exhibitors and also allow for nightly floor cleaning in the Pavilion, the following rules for the placement of crates are implemented:

- 1) There will be no crating allowed between the doors (under the windows) leading to the stairs.
- 2) If crates are left in the Pavilion overnight, all cloth and metal crates that can fold, must be folded and placed against the wall (along with any other personal gear) before the exhibitor leaves the building for the day. Hard crates must also be placed against the wall. The main area of the floor must be clear so that it can be swept nightly.
- 3) During the hours of the trials, crates in use will be arranged in rows, with aisles kept clear so that people and dogs can easily move through the area. This will meet a requirement issued by the Fire Marshall. The Obedience Chairs will gladly assist in the placement of crates.  
*If you have questions about these requirements, contact the Obedience Chair for the hosting club.*

### FEMALES IN SEASON IN OBEDIENCE & RALLY:

Females in season are not permitted to compete. If a female is withdrawn from competition because it came into season and the event secretary is notified no later than one half hour prior to the start of the first class in the trial, the club is required to refund the entry fee. This club will not retain a processing fee. Note: No fee is paid to the AKC for females in season who are withdrawn.
